“75 Years of Mountain Search and Rescue, A Retrospective of Rocky Mountain Rescue Group’s Service to Boulder County and beyond”

The Rocky Mountain Rescue Group (RMRG) is one of the oldest and busiest mountain search and rescue teams in the country. RMRG started as a grassroots effort in 1947 and has grown to 200 calls per year. RMRG has been a leader in developing mountain search and rescue equipment and techniques in this field that continues to evolve. RMRG’s all-volunteer professional staff provide its services for free 24 / 7 / 365. This equates to 15,000+ hours per year of search and rescue calls, training, and running this non-profit organization.

The program will begin with a presentation on what we do and how we do it, including speakers, photos, and videos from our 75 years. The presentation will cover search and rescue operations including vertical (cliff) evacuations, searches for downed aircraft, avalanche rescue, evacuation of injured hikers, and searches for lost parties in the mountains.
